If you would like to fax them in and then pay when you get here, that is fine, please fax to 780 842 6248. There will be a concession on site, so please plan on supporting it as profits go to CHARMD.

There is room to camp for those who wish to do so, some of the sites have power. All other accommodations will be up to you.

After unloading your horses, you will be asked to park your trailers in the parking area to allow others the room to unload.

We will be of course holding our annual Saturday night Banquet and Auction, please bring your auction items as this is one of our biggest (and most entertaining) fundraisers of the year.

You are more than welcome and invited to arrive early Friday and get settled, there will be a social Friday night.

We are looking and in need of Sponsor's for all classes, a "Class" sponsorship is worth \$40.00, please consider one from your farm or business

I would encourage all members to try and make it to the show, it will be a fun weekend of showing off our horses.

CHARMD HORSE SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. This show will run under the rules of Equine Canada with the following local show rules.
2. The Show Committee reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the rules, prize list and/or programs/schedule and to amend any rules it deems necessary.
3. All owners, exhibitors, riders, drivers and handlers must be current Alberta Equestrian Federation members. List all necessary membership numbers on the entry form.
4. Upon any act of discourtesy or disobedience, the Show Committee reserves the right to remove any owner/lessee, trainer, groom, rider or horse from the show and/or the show grounds without being held liable for any compensation whatsoever.
5. CHARMD, the Show Committee and Light Speed Stable will not be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to persons, horses or property at this show. No entries will be accepted without signed releases.
6. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing when their animal will be judged. Animals must be in the show ring promptly after being called.
7. Dogs on the grounds must be on a leash at all times.
8. Age of horse shall be as of January 1, 2009.
9. Exhibitors are juniors until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of eighteen.
10. Mature stallions must be shown with a chain.
11. An open class is defined as a class open to both junior and senior exhibitors.
12. A groom is optional in driving classes.
13. **SAFETY REGULATION:** All persons riding over fences anywhere on the competition grounds must wear an ASTM approved protective headgear and harness must be securely fastened and the helmet properly fitted. For driving, all junior drivers must wear ASTM approved helmets when in carts. Helmets are encouraged for Juniors in Western as well as all other classes. Junior riders will not be penalized for wearing protective headgear. **SAFETY IS A TOP PRIORITY.**
14. Once a class has been declared complete by the Steward, late arrivals will not be allowed in the ring.
15. In case of inclement weather, classes may be moved or cancelled.
16. Outdoor arena will be open for warm-up as posted during the show.
17. Exhibitors are responsible for their own manure management. Please pick up after your horse.
18. Exhibitors cancelling their entries shall forfeit their entry fees, except on submission of certificate of disability from a qualified Veterinarian, or medical doctor on or before the show date.

Classes

HALTER CLASSES

1. **Foals** - open to fillies and colts born after Jan 1st, 2009
2. **Fillies** – 2 & 3 Year Olds
3. **Mares** – 4 Years & Over
4. **Champion Mare** – 1st and 2nd place fillies and mares from class #1, #2 and #3
5. **Colts** – 2 & 3 Year Olds
6. **Stallions** – 4 Years & Over
7. **Champion Stallion** – 1st and 2nd place colts and stallions from class #1, #5 and #6
8. **Geldings** – any age
9. **Showmanship Open** – Open to all horses. Judged 50% on performance and 50% on overall appearance of exhibitor and horse.

PERFORMANCE CLASSES

10. **Dressage CADORA Training Level Test B Open (BB)** – Pattern included. Readers are not allowed.
11. **English Pleasure Open** –To be shown at a walk, trot and canter. To be judged on performance, manners and conformation.
12. **English Pleasure Junior Horse** - Horses must be 5 years of age or younger. To be shown at a walk, trot and canter. To be judged on performance, manners and conformation.
13. **English Equitation Open** –Riders are judged at a walk, trot and canter both ways of the ring. A pattern will be posted for individual performance to be performed at the completion of the under saddle portion.
14. **Jumper** – 18” maximum. Open to junior and senior riders. This is a timed fault event. Course will be posted. Rider may walk the course.
15. **Jumper** - 2’3” maximum. Open to junior and senior riders. This is a timed fault event. Course will be posted. Rider may walk the course.
16. **Jumper** – 3’ maximum. Open to junior and senior riders. This is a timed fault event. Course will be posted. Rider may walk the course.
17. **Western Pleasure Open** –To be shown at a walk, jog and lope. To be judged on performance, manners and conformation. No snaffle bits or bosals - must be ridden in curb bit with one hand only on reins.
18. **Western Pleasure Junior Horse** - Horses must be 5 years of age or younger. To be shown at a walk, jog and lope. To be judged on performance, manners and conformation. Horse may be shown in permissible hackamore or snaffle bit. Two hands allowed on the reins.
19. **Western Equitation Open** –Riders are judged at a walk, jog and lope both ways of the ring. A pattern will be posted for individual performance to be performed at the completion of the under saddle portion.
20. **Trail Open (BB)** - Horses must be shown over and through obstacles. Entries to be judged on performance over obstacles, with emphasis on manners, response to rider and attitude. Horses shall be penalized for any unnecessary delay while approaching obstacles. This will be an Equine Canada style event with a Gate, Bridge, Poles, backing obstacle, carrying item and side pass on a pattern to be posted prior to event. There is no time limit to complete, however judge may ask you to move on if deemed you are having trouble with an obstacle. Dismounting of horse is elimination and you will be asked to leave the course immediately. Rider may walk the course.
21. **Reining Open** – NRHA Pattern #5 (included). This is a western ridden event following a posted pattern done from memory. All horses will be judged immediately upon entering the arena, and judging will cease after the last manoeuvre. All deviations from the exact written pattern must be considered a lack of or temporary loss of control, and therefore faulted according to severity of deviation. Credit will be given for smoothness, finesse, attitude, quickness and authority in performing the various manoeuvres while using controlled speed.
22. **Barrel Racing (BB)** - This event is timed and uses the four barrel pattern and rules from the Battle of the Breeds.

Vaulting Demonstration

- 23. Costume Class** - horse and/or ridden to be dressed/decorated as you wish, with safety in mind.
- 24. Leadline** – 6 years & under. To be shown at a walk both ways of the ring. Rider not eligible for any other class in the show except Costume Class. Handler must be 18 years or older.
- 25. Junior Pleasure** – Open to junior riders in english or western attire. To be shown at a walk, trot/jog and canter/lope. To be judged on performance, manners and conformation.
- 26. Junior Equitation** – Open to junior riders in english or western attire. Riders are judged at a walk, trot/jog and canter/lope both ways of the ring. A pattern will be posted for individual performance to be performed at the completion of the under saddle portion.
- 27. Jeopardy Trail (BB)** - This will be a posted course with points given per obstacle. Each competitor has 250 seconds to go through all of the obstacles they wish in any order. Some obstacles may be built so that they can be passed through/over from both directions. The competitor is credited with the number of points carried by each obstacle that has been successfully completed. No points are awarded if any part of the obstacle is altered or not completed. Each obstacle may be negotiated only once; however it is not necessary to negotiate all obstacles. Horses may be ridden Western or English. When the fixed time of 250 seconds is reached, the competitor may complete an obstacle they have begun and then cross the finish line. This obstacle will count if it is completed correctly. An obstacle will be provided marked as the “Jeopardy Challenge” and is worth 100 points. After the competitor has crossed the finish line, the judge will give the signal at which point the competitor has the option to complete the “Jeopardy Challenge.” If the obstacle is completed successfully within 40 seconds, 100 points will be added to the total score, BUT if the obstacle is not completed successfully within the time, 100 points will be deducted from the total score. The competitor may choose not to try this obstacle without penalty. The competitor who has obtained the greatest number of points will be declared the winner. In the event of equality of points, the competitor with the fastest time between the start line and the finish line will be the winner. In the event that points and time for first place are equal, there will be a ride-off according to the same formula with a fixed time of 60 seconds. Rider may walk the course.
- 28. Jeopardy Jumping (BB)** - 3’ maximum. This will be a posted course with points given per jump. The competitor is credited with the number of points carried by each jump that has been successfully completed. No points are awarded if any part of the jump is altered or not completed. When the fixed time is reached, an obstacle will be provided marked as the “Jeopardy Jump” and is worth 100 points. After the competitor has crossed the finish line, the judge will give the signal at which point the competitor has the option to complete the “Jeopardy Jump.” If the obstacle is completed successfully within 30 seconds, 100 points will be added to the total score, BUT if the obstacle is not completed successfully within the time, 100 points will be deducted from the total score. The competitor may choose not to try this obstacle without penalty. The competitor who has obtained the greatest number of points will be declared the winner. In the event of equality of points, the competitor with the fastest time between the start line and the finish line will be the winner. In the event that points and time for first place are equal, there will be a ride-off according to the same formula with a fixed time of 60 seconds. Rider may walk the course.
- 29. Pleasure Driving Open** –Horses to be shown to a two or four-wheeled vehicle suitable for pleasure. To be shown both ways in the ring, at a walk, working trot, slow trot and a strong trot, and to stand quietly and back readily. To be judged 60% on performance, manners and way of going; 40% on fit of harness and vehicle and neatness of attire.
- 30. Junior Pleasure Driving** – Open to junior drivers. Horses to be shown to a two or four-wheeled vehicle suitable for pleasure. To be shown both ways in the ring, at a walk, working trot, slow trot and a strong trot, and to stand quietly and back readily. To be judged 60% on performance, manners and way of going; 40% on fit of harness and vehicle and neatness of attire.
- 31. Driven Dressage (BB)** - As in ridden dressage, Driven Dressage involves a pattern done from memory. The pattern will be the same as used in the Battle of the Breeds.
- 32. Driving - Cones (BB)** – This is a timed event. Drivers negotiate a course of paired cones in the order of course posted. Any balls knocked down are given a one second penalty. Driver may walk the course.
- 33. Obstacles Driving (BB)** – This is a timed event. Drivers negotiate a course of obstacles and penalties will be assessed for partially completed obstacles. Driver may walk the course.

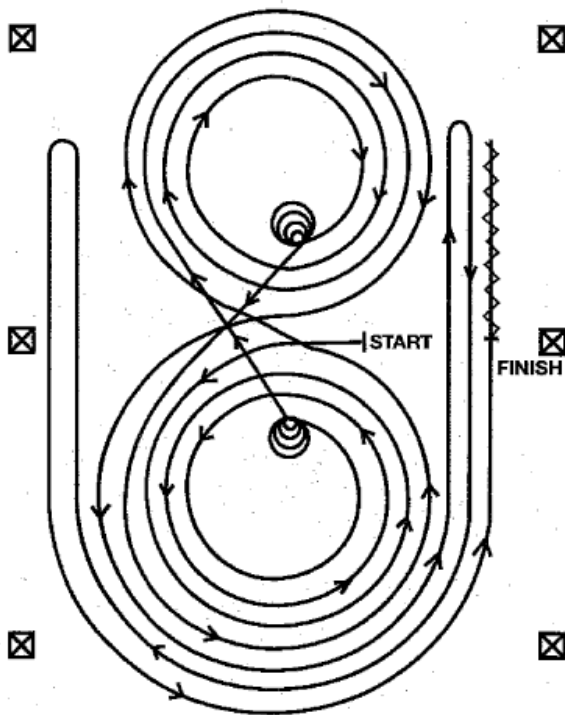

PATTERN 5



Pattern 5

Horses may walk or trot to the center of arena. Horses must walk or stop prior to starting pattern. Beginning at the center of the arena facing the left wall or fence.

1. Beginning on the left lead, complete three circles to the left: the first two circles large and fast; the third circle small and slow. Stop at the center of the arena. Hesitate.

2. Complete four spins to the left. Hesitate.

3. Beginning on the right lead, complete three circles to the right: the first two circles large and fast; the third circle small and slow. Stop at the center of the arena. Hesitate.

4. Complete four spins to the right. Hesitate.

5. Beginning on the left lead, run a large fast circle to the left, change leads at the center of the arena, run a large fast circle to the right, and change leads at the center of the arena. (Figure 8)

6. Continue around previous circle to the left but do not close this circle. Run up the right side of the arena past the center marker and do a right rollback at least twenty feet from the wall or fence – no hesitation.

7. Continue around previous circle but do not close this circle. Run up the left side of the arena past the center marker and do a left rollback at least twenty feet from the wall or fence – no hesitation.

8. Continue back around previous circle but do not close this circle. Run up the right side of the arena past the center marker and do a sliding stop at least twenty feet from the wall or fence. Back up at least ten feet. Hesitate to demonstrate completion of the pattern.

Rider must dismount and drop bridle to the designated judge.

EVERY PARTICIPANT IN THE CHARMD HORSE SHOW SHALL CAREFULLY READ THIS NOTICE BEFORE SIGNING; NO PARTICIPANT WILL BE ALLOWED TO COMPETE PRIOR TO SIGNING THIS FORM AS REQUIRED. "Inherent risks of equine activities" shall mean those dangers or conditions which are an integral part of equine activities, including but not limited to:

1. The propensity of any equine to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm or death to persons on or around them and/or damage to property in their vicinity;
2. The unpredictability of an equine's reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement and unfamiliar objects, persons or other animals;
3. The equine's response to certain hazards such as surface and subsurface objects;
4. Collisions with other equines, animals, people and objects;
5. The potential of a participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others, such as failing to maintain control over the equine or to act within his or her ability.

Neither the Alberta Equestrian Federation, Light Speed Stable, CHARMD, the organizing committee of the show, officials, volunteers, staff nor agents shall in any way be liable for any accident, injury, damage, loss or for any other matter that may happen to exhibitors, competitors, owners, agents or to anyone on the grounds or to any animal or article brought to the grounds. It is to be understood and agreed that by making any entry in the CHARMD Horse Show all exhibitors, competitors, owners, agents and representatives acknowledge that equestrian sports involve inherent risk and do hereby indemnify and hold harmless the Alberta Equestrian Federation, Light Speed Stable, CHARMD, officials, the owners, directors, officers, member employees, agents and volunteers thereof from and against any and all loss, costs or expenses, or any claim thereof of whatever nature arising or to arise for and on accounts, or by reasons of participation in this show. I hereby accept this risk and hold harmless Alberta Equestrian Federation, the competition, their officials, organizers, agents, employees, and their representatives."
