### 1. ENTRIES:

a. Entry deadline: June 17, 2018. Send entries to Jessica Chagnon via e-mail [Jessica.chagnon09@gmail.com](mailto:Jessica.chagnon09@gmail.com) or phone 587-893-4032.

The earlier you get your entries in, the easier it is for us to organize the show!

b. Payment is generally made at the show.

### 2. STABLING:

a. Stalls - \$25/day, includes shavings, must be stripped prior to leaving

b. Pen - \$20/horse/day

### 3. ACCOMODATIONS:

a. Camping is available on the show grounds.

LQ/Trailer parking - \$10/night

LQ/RV hookup - \$20/night

b. Hotels in Sundre and Olds

### 4. CATERING:

a. There will be a concession on the grounds for the whole weekend. **Please support our concession. We have a hard time booking them as we are a small event.**

b. Saturday night will be a catered supper at \$20/plate.

5. **DOGS:** must be on a leash at all times. Please clean up after your pet.

### 6. HORSES:

a. Any registered purebred Canadian Horse is eligible to compete. CLRC registration # must be shown on entry form. Exceptions made for this years foals. Please pick up all manure.

b. Age of horse shall be that reached during the calendar year 2018.

c. Stallions can only be handled by adults. 18+

d. Mature stallions must be shown with a chain in halter classes.

### 7. EXHIBITORS:

a. All owners, exhibitors, riders, drivers and handlers must be current Alberta Equestrian Federation members (or other provincial sport organization with equivalent insurance).

b. Junior exhibitors are under 18 yrs.

c. Exhibitors are responsible for knowing when their horse will be judged. Horses must be in the show ring promptly.

### 8. HELMETS:

a. Will never be penalized ... in any class!

b. Are mandatory for all Juniors.

c. Are mandatory for all competitors in jumping classes. All persons riding over fences anywhere on the competition grounds must wear ASTM approved protective headgear. Harness must be securely fastened and the helmet properly fitted.

d. Are mandatory for all driven classes except Driven Pleasure.

### 9. RULES:

a. This show will run under the rules of Equine Canada with the following local show rules:

b. The Show Committee reserves the right to decide any point not covered by the rules, prize list and/or programs/schedule, and to amend any rules it deems necessary.

c. The Show Committee reserves the right to remove any owner/lessee, trainer, groom, rider or horse from the show and/or the show grounds without being held liable for any compensation whatsoever.

d. CHARMD, the Show Committee and Eagle Hill Equine will not be responsible for any loss, damage or injury to persons, horses, or property at this show. No entries will be accepted without signed releases.

e. An Open class is defined as a class open to both junior and senior exhibitors.

f. Warm-up areas will be available during the show.

g. Once a class has been declared complete by the Steward, late arrivals will not be allowed in the ring.

h. No coaching from the sidelines. Any exhibitor being coached will be given one warning, then excused from the class.

### 10. BATTLE OF THE BREEDS TEAM SELECTION:

It is unknown if there will be a Battle this year, but if there is we would like to be ready to put a team in. Show results help in selecting Team Canadian Horse. (Ridden Dressage, Jumping, Barrel Race, Trail, and Driven Obstacles). If you are interested in trying out for a Battle Team, make sure to enter these classes.

### 11. LITTLE IRON HORSE COMPETITION:

This competition consists of Equitation Trail, Trail Race, Stoneboat Pull and ¼ Mile Trot. If you'd like to compete for the Little Iron Horse title, you must enter these classes.

## CLASS DESCRIPTIONS:

### HALTER CLASSES

1. **Foal of 2018:** open to fillies and colts born on or after Jan 1, 2018. F names
2. **Yearling:** open to fillies, geldings and colts born on or after Jan 1, 2017. E names
3. **Fillies 2 & 3 yrs old.** C & D names
4. **Mares 4 yrs and over**
5. **Champion Mare** – 1<sup>st</sup> place fillies and mares from classes 1,2,3, & 4 are invited back into the ring to compete for the champion mare. This is not a class that you enter. You must win your way into this one.
6. **Colts 2 & 3 yrs old.** C & D names
7. **Geldings 4 yrs and over**
8. **Champion Gelding** – 1<sup>st</sup> place geldings from classes 1, 2, 6, & 7 are invited back into the ring to compete for the champion gelding. This is not a class that you enter. You must win your way into this one.
9. **Stallions 4 yrs and over**
10. **Champion Stallion** – 1<sup>st</sup> place stallions from classes 1, 2, 6, & 9 will be invited back into the ring to compete for the champion stallion. This is not a class that you enter. You must win your way into this one.
11. **Halter Champion** – 1<sup>st</sup> place from classes 5, 8, & 10 will be invited back into the ring to compete for the Halter Championship. This is not a class that you enter. You must win your way into this one.

### IN HAND CLASSES

12. **Open Halter Showmanship:** open to all horses and exhibitors. There will be a pattern posted. Judged 50% on accurate and correct performance of the pattern, and 50% on overall appearance of exhibitor and horse.
28. **In Hand Trail:** Horses are lead through the trail course. This class is open to all horses that are not yet under saddle. Usually young horses, but CHARMD is open to any age of horse. You will have a set amount of time in which to collect as many points as you can. 'WE Ease of Handling' obstacles will be used. Each obstacle can only be done once. Remember that this class is designed to ready your horse for ridden trail class, so lead your horse through the class as if you were on his back. This is a show class, not a training exercise. Please practice at home prior to the show. Be safe!

### WESTERN or ENGLISH PERFORMANCE CLASSES

13. **Lead Line Class:** for children that do not yet ride on their own. You may ride in English or Western tack and safe footwear. To be shown at a walk and trot (depending on comfort level of riders). Handler must be 18 years or older.
14. **Green Rider Equitation:** This class caters to nervous, novice riders. You may ride in English or Western tack and attire. To be shown at walk, trot/jog and possibly canter/lope. Riders not comfortable at the canter/lope may come to the centre of the ring. The judge may ask you to ride a pattern. In this class, it is the skill of the rider that is being judged (seat, hands, ability to control and show the horse). Riders should try to display poise and confidence.
16. **Junior Rider Pleasure:** for junior riders, in English or Western tack and attire. Horses will be judged on their performance, manners and way of going at a walk, trot/jog and canter/lope. Riders not ready for the canter/lope may come to the centre of the ring. Judged on horse performance, manners, way of going, smoothness of ride, alertness and responsiveness to cues.
15. **Junior Rider Equitation:** for junior riders, in English or Western tack and attire. Riders are judged at the walk, trot/jog and canter/lope, and may be asked to ride a pattern. Riders not ready for the canter/lope may come to the centre of the ring. In this class, it is the skill of the rider that is being judged (seat, hands, ability to control and show the horse). Cues and aids should not be noticeable. Riders should display a precise ride in total unison with their horse, exhibiting poise and confidence.
26. **Equitation Trail (Working Equitation - Ease of Handling):** This is a trail class ridden as an equitation class. It involves negotiating the horse around obstacles with style, balance, suppleness and obedience. As in any equitation class, be mindful of your seat, hands and confidence. Aim to guide, control and show your horse to the best of its ability. Cues and aids should not be noticeable. Your trail or "Lines" should be smooth with no sharp corners. All turns should be well rounded. Riders should display a precise ride in total unison with their horse. Remember, it's an Equitation class. All obstacles are numbered for order of completion. A red marker or number will indicate the direction an obstacle is to be entered. That red marker should always be on the riders right hand side.

27. **Trail Race (Working Equitation - Speed):** Horses are ridden around, through and over obstacles at speed, yet carefully, as knocking down or upsetting an obstacle is cause for elimination!

All obstacles are numbered for order of completion. A red marker or number will indicate the direction an obstacle is to be entered. That red marker should always be on the riders right hand side.

#### **WESTERN PERFORMANCE CLASSES**

34. **Barrel Race:** This event is timed and uses the standard 3 barrel cloverleaf pattern.

33. **Western Pleasure:** to be show at a walk, jog and lope. Horses will be judged on performance, manners, and way of going. Snaffle bits are only allowed on horses 5 yrs of age and younger; all others must be ridden in a shank bit with one hand on the reins. Judged on horse performance, manners, way of going, smoothness of ride, alertness and responsiveness to cues.

#### **ENGLISH PERFORMANCE CLASSES:**

22. **English Pleasure:** Horses are judged on their performance, manners, and way of going. To be shown at walk, trot and canter. Judged on horse performance, manners, way of going, smoothness of ride, alertness and responsiveness to cues.

#### **DRESSAGE CLASSES:**

Working Equitation Canada Dressage Tests will be used this year. Readers are allowed. Riders will go in number order.

23. Dressage WE CAN Level 2

24. Dressage WE CAN Level 3(Battle Class)

**JUMPING CLASSES: A horse and rider combination may enter a maximum of two jumper classes.**

The following are open classes. This is a timed fault event. Each class will consist of jumps up to and including the specified height. The course map will be posted and riders will have an opportunity to walk the course.

17. **Jumper 18" max**

18. **Jumper 2'3" max**

19. **Jumper 2'6" max**

20. **Jumper 3' max**

21. **Jeopardy Jumping:** No set course. Each obstacle jumped successfully is worth a set number of points. Each obstacle may be jumped a maximum of 3 times non-consecutively. You will have a set amount of time in which to collect as many points as you can. All types of jumps from cross rails to 3'6" oxers.

**DRIVING CLASSES: These classes are designed for 2 wheeled vehicles, but horses may be put to any safe two or four-wheeled vehicle.**

30. **Pleasure Driving:** Horses are judged on their performance, manners, and way of going. To be shown at walk, slow trot, working trot, and extended trot. Judged on horse performance, manners, way of going, smoothness of drive, alertness and responsiveness to cues.

29. **Driven Trail:** No set course. Each obstacle completed successfully is worth a set number of points. You will have a set amount of time in which to collect as many points as you can. Regular and unusual trail obstacles will be used. Each obstacle can only be done once.

31. **Stoneboat Pull:** A precision class. Horse is brought into the ring harnessed, is then hooked to the stoneboat or another type of drag. You will begin at a start line and must stop with the back end of the stoneboat over, but as close to the finish line as possible.

32. **¼ Mile Trot:** You must trot from start to finish as fast as possible without breaking out of a trot.

#### **FUN CLASSES:**

35. **Costume Class:** Horse and rider/handler to be dressed/decorated as you wish, keeping safety in mind. Horses will be walked around the ring, and may be led in hand. Creativity is the idea here!

25. **Simon Says:** A rail class in which you may be asked to walk, trot, canter, halt, back, reverse direction, extended trot, counter canter, jog, gallop, etc. But don't do it unless you hear 'Simon Says"! If you are called out, please stand in the centre of the arena. Last one on the rail wins.

36. **Bribe A Horse:** An obstacle or obstacles are set in the arena. You are allowed to carry 1 small treat which is provided. The start line is just inside the gate. You lead your horse into the arena. Once the gate is closed, the horse is set free. You must successfully have your horse follow you to and through the obstacle/s and back across the start/finish line. Fastest time wins. 5 second penalty for every time you touch your horse, his/her halter, or give the treat.
